

OSHA 500 Level Classes

These courses are conducted in conjunction with Midwest OSHA Education Center.



OSHA 500 Trainer Course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for Construction.

This 4 day course authorizes those who successfully complete the program to conduct 10 & 30 hour outreach classes to the construction industry and issue OTI participant cards. Course time is spent learning and practicing adult training techniques. Students will participate in the development and delivery of presentations covering construction safety topics during class. Students will receive an instructor card and certificate from the Midwest OSHA Education Center. As a prerequisite for the class, participants must provide verification of OSHA 510 class completion and management confirmation of at least 5 years of relevant construction safety experience.

OSHA 501 Trainer Course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for General Industry.

This 4 day course authorizes those who successfully complete the program to conduct 10 & 30 hour outreach classes to those in general industry environments and issue OTI participant cards. Course time is spent learning and practicing adult training techniques. Students will participate in the development and delivery of presentations covering general industry safety topics during class. Students will receive an instructor card and certificate from the Midwest OSHA Education Center. As a prerequisite for the class, participants must provide verification of OSHA 511 class completion and management confirmation of at least 5 years of relevant safety experience.

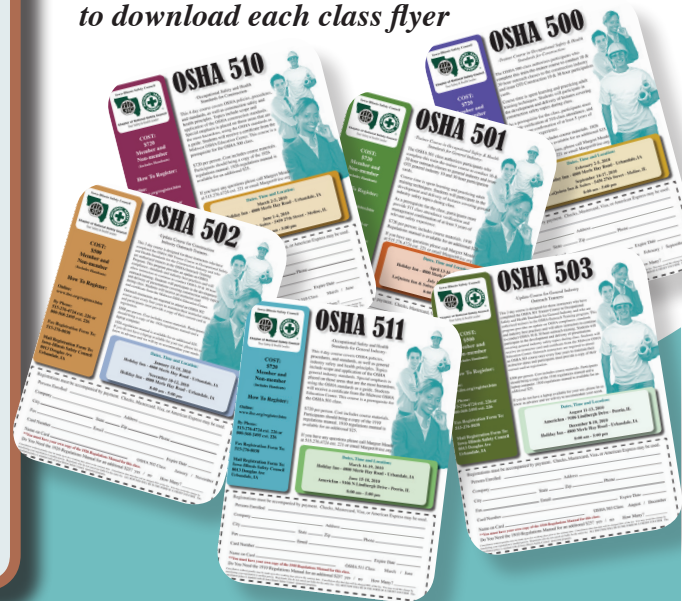
OSHA 502 Update Course for Construction Industry Outreach Trainers.

This 3 day course is designed for those instructors who have completed the OSHA 500 Trainer Course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for the Construction Industry and who are authorized trainers in the OSHA Outreach Training Program. This program provides an update on OSHA compliance, standards and industry best practices and will allow instructors to continue to conduct OSHA 10 & 30 hour outreach training. Students will participate in the development and delivery of presentations covering construction safety topics during class. Students will receive an instructor card and certificate from the Midwest OSHA Education Center. Outreach instructors are required to attend an OSHA 502 course once every four years to maintain their instructor status and participants must provide a copy of their current card at registration.

OSHA 503 Update Course for General Industry Outreach Trainers.

This 3 day course is designed for those instructors who have completed the OSHA 501 Trainer Course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for General Industry and who are authorized trainers in the OSHA Outreach Training program. This program provides an update on OSHA compliance, standards and industry best practices and will allow instructors to continue to conduct OSHA 10 & 30 hour outreach training. Students will participate in the development and delivery of presentations covering general industry safety topics during class. Students will receive an instructor card and certificate from the Midwest OSHA Education Center. Outreach instructors are required to attend an OSHA 503 course once every four years to maintain their instructor status and participants must provide a copy of their current card at registration.

OSHA 510 - Occupational Safety and Health Standards for Construction

This 4 day course covers OSHA policies, procedures, and standards, as well as construction safety and health principles. Topics include scope and application of the OSHA construction standards. Special emphasis is placed on those areas that are the most hazardous, using the OSHA standards as a guide. Students will receive a certificate from the Midwest OSHA Education Center. This course is a prerequisite for the OSHA 500 class.

OSHA 511 - Occupational Safety and Health Standards for General Industry

This 4 day course covers OSHA policies, procedures, and standards, as well as general industry safety and health principles. Topics include scope and application of the OSHA general industry standards. Special emphasis is placed on those areas that are the most hazardous, using the OSHA standards as a guide. Students will receive a certificate from the Midwest OSHA Education Center. This course is a prerequisite for the OSHA 501 class.
